JULY 2015

Council approves ordinance to move to a single-hauler trash system.

NOVEMBER 2015

Public hearing is held on RFP. Goal to start program in Apr. 2016.

APRIL 2016

Mailed postcard survey to learn about current service and cost.

MAY 2016

Council awards contract to Waste Management on May 23.

JULY 2016

Service begins July 1 for 10,000 plus residents.

NO TIME TO WASTE

Trash Update



Waste Management of Michigan, Inc. will begin providing City-wide trash, recycling, yard waste and bulk collection services on July 1 for all residents who receive curbside pick-up and do not have a current contract with a trash provider.

What's included?

When the program is fully implemented, residents will be provided a 64-gallon recycling cart and a 96-gallon trash cart. You may also use trash bags or your own trash container no larger than 35 gallons in size and no more than 60 pounds when full. During the initial phase, residents will be asked to use their current carts for recycling and trash, which will be eventually replaced with new Waste Management carts when the roll out is complete in August/September.

Cost?

The \$159 annual cost will be collected as a fee on your tax bill and includes trash, recycling, yard waste and bulk item collection upon request. Since summer tax bills have already been processed, your initial trash collection fee will be included with winter taxes and will cover service for an entire year. Moving forward, your fee will reflect half the yearly payment on each tax bill.

Detailed Information

A mailing including your trash collection day and additional program details will be sent to ALL residents impacted by this change, and more information about the new trash collection process will be released in the coming weeks.



OBSTACLES TO SUCCESS

Short time frame to educate residents on new program

Residents **did not have** carts from WM when service started


Had to **negotiate** an agreement with other trash providers to allow residents to keep carts until new ones arrived

Four days before transition, one provider pulled carts from large subdivision – impacting 340+ residents.



City begins new trash/recycling service

The City of Novi has selected Waste Management of Michigan Inc. to be the sole provider of curbside trash and recycling collection services.

Starting Friday, July 1, 2016, Waste Management will begin providing city-wide trash, recycling and yard waste services for most residents in the City of Novi.

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
Starting Friday, July 1, 2016, Waste Management will begin providing city-wide trash, recycling and yard waste services for most residents in the City of Novi.

For most residents, this means your trash and recycling service day will change.

(Those under contract with another provider will continue that service until contract expires).

Note: The July 4th holiday will affect service the week of July 4. Service will be one day behind (Monday service will happen on Tuesday, July 5, Tuesday service on Wednesday, July 6, Thursday service on Friday, July 8, and Friday service on Saturday, July 9). Service will resume as usual on Monday, July 11.

About the Transition

The change to Waste Management will be a phased approach. During this first phase, residents will be asked to use their current waste cart they have at home, even if it is not a Waste Management cart. This may be your existing cart from Advanced Disposal, Republic or Duncan, or your own 35-gallon container and trash bags you use currently.

The distribution of Waste Management carts will be in the early fall, and we will notify you when the cart rollout begins.

The \$159 annual cost will be collected as a fee on your tax bill and includes trash, recycling, yard waste and bulk item collection upon request. Since summer tax bills have been processed, your initial trash collection fee will all be included with winter taxes and will cover service for the entire year. Moving forward, your fee will be split between summer and winter tax bills.

On Your Service Day

Please have your waste and recycling at the curb no later than 7 a.m. on your scheduled service day. Waste and recycling is collected on your service day once per week.

Yard waste is collected once per week from the first Monday in April through the Friday of the last week in November. Trash and recycling will be collected by 6 p.m.



Recycling

Waste Management will also be collecting recyclables at the same time. You may already have a separate recycling bin or cart. Keep using that for now. If you don't have a recycling bin or cart, please use a 32-35 gallon container clearly marked "Recycling" and it will be collected.



Yard Waste

Yard waste, including grass clippings, will also be collected. Yard waste cannot be mixed with trash for disposal. Put yard waste into a paper yard waste sack or clearly marked container with handles, no more than 35 gallons in capacity and no heavier than 60 pounds.



Bulk Items

Household furniture, a mattress and box spring or a refrigerator are examples of bulk items that will be picked up at no additional cost. Call Waste Management at 866-797-9018 (7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday) for more details.



Frequently Asked Questions

When will I receive new carts?

In early fall, Waste Management will provide residents with a 64-gallon recycling cart and a 96-gallon trash cart. You may also use trash bags or your own trash container no larger than 35 gallons in size and no more than 60 pounds when full. You will receive additional communication prior to the new cart rollout in early fall, including the plan for pickup of your existing carts.

Will I have the option of moving to a smaller trash bin?

Yes, residents will be given the opportunity to exchange the 96-gallon cart for a smaller 64-gallon cart via a returned postcard, which will be included when Waste Management delivers your new cart later this year. If you would like a smaller cart, simply fill out the postcard mail it in, and Waste Management will handle the exchange.

When can I put out my trash, recycling, and yard waste?

Per city ordinance, you should not put out waste or recycling bins earlier than 24 hours prior to the scheduled collection day. It is the responsibility of both the property owner and the property occupant to place refuse at the designated collection site within a refuse bin, sealed container or plastic bag to prevent objectionable odors, or spillage of refuse upon any public or private site. All receptacles must be removed from such areas no later than 12 hours following the actual collection.

Do I have to cancel my current service?

No, if your service (a subscription, quarterly or month-to-month) ends on June 30, you do not need to do anything. Your current provider knows that the City of Novi assumes responsibility as of July 1.

I have a contract with my current provider. What do I do?

The City of Novi will honor contracts but we need a hard/digital version of the contract in order to verify that a subdivision is under contract. Please contact the City of Novi's Department of Public Services Customer Service Team at 248-745-5640 with any questions about billing.
